#### ORANGE SHIRT DAY AT JOHN HOWITT ELEMENTARY: Thursday September 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022 (*Please wear orange*)

Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) Residential School (1891-1981) Commemoration Project and Reunion events that took place in Williams Lake in May 2013. This project was the vision of Esketemc (Alkali Lake) Chief Fred Robbins, who is a former student himself. It brought together former students and their families from the Secwepemc, Tsilhqot'in, Southern Dakelh and St'at'imc Nations along with the Cariboo Regional District, the Mayors and municipalities, School Districts, and civic organizations in the Cariboo Region.

Wearing an orange shirt was designed to commemorate the residential school experience, to

witness and honour the healing journey of the survivors and their families, and to commit to the ongoing process of reconciliation.

Orange Shirt Day grew out of Phyllis (Jack) Webstad's story of having her shiny new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the Mission, and it has become an opportunity to keep the discussion on all aspects of residential schools happening annually.



The end of September was chosen because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential

schools, and because it is an opportunity to set the stage for anti-racism and anti-bullying policies for the coming school year. It also gives teachers time to plan events that will include children, as we want to ensure that we are passing the story and learning on to the next generations.

# <u>There will be no school on Friday September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2022, to honour National Truth and Reconciliation Day.</u>

#### Please consider the following start up details as we start our new school year:

• Arrival and Departure protocol: we ask that students stay near their classrooms when they arrive in the morning and practice social distancing where they can. When leaving the school grounds our bus students will be asked to line up at our staging area and will be called to board the bus when we are ready.

• Mask wearing currently is optional and is a choice of families and students. Any student who asks for a mask will be given one. We will ask student to wash their hands or hand sanitize as they transition into class in the morning, after recess, and after lunch play time. Students will be expected to use positive respiratory etiquette and sneeze or cough into their elbow.

• Please have your child dress appropriately for the weather. You may want to **send an extra set of clothes** that remain at school for those unpredictable

weather days. Raincoats or waterproof jackets, boots, and an umbrella will come in very handy.

#### WHENEVER YOU VISIT THE SCHOOL

To ensure the safety of our students and to minimize the disruption to classes **please check in at the office** whenever you visit the school for whatever reason. Anything to be delivered to a student can be taken can be dropped off at the office and we will deliver to the classroom. If you are picking up your child for an appointment, please make arrangements ahead of time with your child's classroom teacher. Or if it is needed, please come to the office and we will help connect you to your child. If your child is leaving early for the day, we ask that you come to the office to sign them out. Students should speak to a staff member first if they need to use their cellphone to call home.

Students require a parent or guardian to complete and sign a lunch program envelope for each month. Envelopes are available at the office. #### SIGN IN/OUT:

If your child is late coming to school, please ask them to come to the office to sign in. We will then help to connect them to their class. If your child needs to leave early, please let us know ahead of time and we will work to have them ready. Any student leaving early for the day will need to be signed out by a parent or guardian, or other approved adult.

#### HOMEWORK FOR PARENTS: INFO UPDATE

We will be sending home *Demographic Verifier forms* for all students this week. The 2-sided form shows the information we have on file for your children. Please check it over carefully, make any changes or corrections on the form and sign it in the appropriate area. Please have your child *return the signed form to their teacher even if there are no changes.* 



*Student Emergency Preparedness Release Form*: This form will have very important information for us in the event of an emergency like whom can we send your child(ren) in the event we cannot reach you or you cannot get to the school.

**Comfort Kit:** Each class will have a bin stored in the large container on the back field of our school, again, in the event of an emergency. If you have not completed a comfort pack, please send it in ASAP! If you need assistance with the content, please call the school.

*Privacy Consent Form:* Initial to grant permission as indicated on form.

*Indigenous Self-Identification Form*: is a form for families to consider for their students. Following the Ministry of Education guidelines, we send this home each year. If you have questions, please contact Mr. Brown or Mrs. Fryer at the school.

**BC School Fruit and Vegetable Program**: Fruits and vegetables are supplied **free for all students** to encourage healthy eating. Please fill in the form if your child has an allergy, we need to be aware of, or if you do not want your child to participate.

#### **REPORTING A STUDENT ABSENT OR LATE**
