
- Email We maintain email lists for both parents and students and will send notifications to both as appropriate

- My School Day App This App can be found wherever you get your apps. Once downloaded, it can
 be customized to ADSS. The importance to parents is that the App will send push notifications about
 anything happening at the school, everything from notice of a snow day to reminder of PAC
 meetings. It's a handy tool that will send as much or as little info from the school as you choose.
 You can choose to only receive the default information feed, or you can choose to subscribe to
 specific channels on the app (example: Grad or Band) if you want to receive that info too. See the

What does the Career Centre have to offer me?

Youth WORK in Trades - Grades 10,11,12

Secondary School Apprenticeships

This program allows you to earn up to 16 credits toward graduation if you are interested in or currently working in one of the over 100 apprenticeship areas like: welding, cooking, auto mechanics, plumbing, and electrical. Visit www.itabc.ca to see more options. See Mr. Freethy or Mrs. Brooks for more info about this program

Work Experience—Grades 10,11,12

The WEX 12A & WEX 12B courses can allow you to receive 4 credits per course towards graduation for work experiences that are related to your career pathway. See Mr. Parmar if you are interested or want more info

Youth TRAIN in Trades - Grade 12's (sometimes Grade 11's)

Apprenticeship Technical Training

During school hours - This is a program that will allow you to take your first-year trades training such as: Electrical, Automotive, Welding, Professional Chef, Cabinet Making, Plumbing, and more at post-secondary institutions.

Dual Credit Certificate Programs - Grade 12's (sometimes Grade 11's)

This is a full-time program that students can take during their grade 12 year. Include Early Childhood Care and Education, Health Care Assistant, and Human Service Worker. Program schedule is set by NIC and may include day-time, afternoon, or evening courses.

Academic Dual Credit Programs with North Island College in your Grade 12 year.

This opportunity allows you to take first year transferrable University courses at NIC while you are enrolled at ADSS. (Your tuition is covered by the School District.) Options may include English, Sociology, Psychology, Criminology or Business courses during the 2nd Semester (PM).

Emergency Medical Responder Course – Grade 12 (sometimes Grade 11's)

This Academic Dual Credit course is offered through a partnership between SD70 and the Justice Institute of British Columbia. This course takes place within the timetable at ADSS in 2nd Semester and will be delivered within the regularly scheduled timetable.

VARIOUS JOB AND VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES



Make sure to allow it to receive notifications when asked - the school will use them to send out important reminders, information and alerts.

2. Select your school

The first time you start the app you will need to select your school. Choose a province, school district, and finally your school from the lists provided, and tap "confirm". This only needs to be done once.

Subscribe to channels.

Channels let the school administration and teachers send out information specific to your classes and activities, so you get only those notifications for your classes and those of interest to the entire school. To subscribe to channels:

- · Tap the menu icon at the bottom left
- · Select "Select Channels" from the menu
- · Tap the checkbox for the channels you are interested in
- . Tap on the "Done" button.

Remember to check back regularly for new channels that your teachers may have added.

4. Enter your classes

Tap on the gear icon in the bottom right corner. Enter your class names and select colours. You can also enter morning, lunch, and after school activities.

5. Access school and class links and files

The school and teachers will add links and files that provide resources to the school community such as course materials for remote learning, health advisories, and other school, district, and provincial information. To access these school-wide and channel-specific resources: To subscribe to channels:

- Tap the menu icon at the bottom left
- · Select "Files and Links" from the menu.

Remember to check back regularly for new resources that your teachers may have added.

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
